## Minister Osmond Martinez Visits Royal Mayan Shrimp Farm and Banana Growers Association, Commends Innovation and Sustainable Practices

Minister Martinez then visited the BGA, an organization that exemplifies the power of collective action in agriculture. The association's efforts to expand market access, improve productivity, and support local growers were commended as critical to the region's agricultural success.

The industry continues to grapple with high production costs, factoring labour costs as a major contributor and preference erosion. As labour supply needs continue to increase, the reliance on immigrant workers from neighbouring Central American countries has become essential to meeting production demands.

During the visit, Minister Martinez reiterated the government's dedication to supporting such enterprises through facilitative efforts in innovation and policies that foster sustainable growth. The Government recognizes the challenges faced by these industries and is committed to working alongside them to create opportunities and reduce obstacles.

These visits underscore the important role of the agro-productive sector in building a resilient and sustainable economy for the nation. Minister Martinez expressed gratitude to the Royal Mayan Shrimp Farm and the BGA for their invaluable contributions, noting that these facilities represent the forward-thinking, industrious spirit that will drive the primary sector forward.

Minister Martinez was supported by Mr. Andy Sutherland, the Director General for Foreign Trade, and other officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade.
